COLLECTION INSTRUCTIONS

CURBSIDE RECYCLING ITEMS INCLUDE:

All items should be clean & no food residue

No plastic bags of any kind

"When In Doubt, Throw It Out!"

Plastic Bottles (#1 and #2)
Glass (clear, green, brown)
Corrugated Cardboard
Gabletop Drink Containers

Newspaper
Steel Cans
Tin Cans
Aluminum Cans
Cereal Boxes

RESIDENTIAL RECYCLING CONTAINERS:

Each single-family residence will receive one green recycling roll-out cart. Please put all your recyclables in this cart with the lid closed by **7:00 a.m.** and place the cart within five (5) feet of the street on your recycling day. Do not place recyclables in bags inside your cart.

RECYCLING DROP-OFF CENTER:

You may also bring your recyclables to the drop-off center which is located on the southeast corner of NE 24th Street and NE 12th Avenue. Trash, bulk and hazardous waste (HHW) items are **not** acceptable.

RESIDENTIAL GARBAGE CONTAINERS:

Each single-family residence receives a 96 gallon blue garbage roll-out cart. By **7:00 a.m.** on your collection day, this cart must be placed within five (5) feet of the street. It is important to always have the cart facing the street (i.e., the handles are located on the side closest to your residence). All trash must fit inside the cart with the lid closed. In addition to the 96 gallon cart, residents may place one additional bag of trash not exceeding forty (40) pounds in weight on the lid of their closed cart.

Residential customers who are physically disabled or mentally challenged and are unable to place roll-out garbage carts at the curb may request side-door service. Additionally, residential customers who are sixty-five (65) years or older may request to use a smaller sixty-five (65) gallon garbage cart. The City may require sufficient documentation to determine eligibility for side-door service and the use of smaller sixty-five (65) gallon carts.

BULK GARBAGE:

Bulk items may be placed at the curb up to twenty-four (24) hours before your scheduled pick-up date. All items must be at the curb by **7:00 a.m.** on your scheduled bulk pick-up day to ensure pick-up. Bulk trash includes appliances, furniture, yard trimmings and other materials not suitable for normal loading into packer-type vehicles. Bulk collection is not intended for hazardous waste; automobile parts; major construction debris; or trash resulting from commercial landscaping or lawn service transported to a residential unit from elsewhere.

For safety reasons, all mirrors, glass tabletops, window panes, and plate glass must be placed within an additional rigid container. These types of glass represent a serious threat of injury to the employees of Waste Management and will not be picked up unless properly stored. Refrigerators and ovens must have doors removed.

HAZARDOUS WASTE:

Household hazardous waste (HHW) should never be disposed of with regular garbage, recyclables or bulk pick-ups. Items such as batteries, cleaning solutions, electronics, oils, paints, pesticides and more should be disposed of through the monthly Waste Management At-Your-Door Service by calling 1-800-449-7587 to schedule a pick-up.
