**Wilton Manors, FL:** A team of assessors from the Commission for Florida Law Enforcement Accreditation (CFA) will arrive March 25th, 2025 to examine all aspects of the Wilton Manors Police Department's policies and procedures, management, operations, and support services. Wilton Manors has to comply with numerous standards in order to receive accredited status. Many of the standards are critical to life, health, safety issues, and best practices.

The Wilton Manors Police has been continuously accredited since 2010. If the department successfully meets all 236 standards during this year's assessment, they will be designated as an Excelsior agency by the Commission. The Excelsior Recognition program recognizes some of the finest criminal justice agencies in the State of Florida, and a demonstrated level of commitment to the Florida Accreditation process unparalleled in the criminal justice profession. Excelsior designation is the highest level of achievement in Florida accreditation a criminal justice agency can receive.

As part of the assessment, agency members and the general public are invited to offer comments to the assessment team. A copy of the standards manual is available on the CFA website at [www.flaccreditation.org](http://www.flaccreditation.org) under the standards tab.

The accreditation program manager for Wilton Manors Police is Mr. Doug Robertson. He said the assessment team is composed of assessors from similar agencies. The assessors will review written materials, interview individuals, visit offices and other areas where compliance can be observed.

Once the Commission's assessors complete their review of the agency, they report to the full Commission, which then determines if the agency is to receive reaccredited status. The department's accreditation is valid for three years. Verification by the team that Wilton Manors meets the Commission's standards is part of a voluntary process to maintain accreditation--a highly prized recognition of professional excellence, Chief Gary Blocker said.
